

**Town of Paoli**  
**Minutes of the Paoli Safety Board Special Session**  
**September 2, 2025**

The Paoli Safety Board met in Special Session at 5:00 P.M. on the above date. Town Council President, Bobbie Bostock led the Pledge of Allegiance. Present were Donna Dillard, Arla Jean Frazier, Mylea Pluris, Theron Owen and Bobbie Bostock. Also in attendance were Clerk-Treasurer Beth Jones and Town Attorney Hunt Reynolds.


Town Council President, Bobbie Bostock, asked Town Attorney, Hunt Reynolds, to explain what a Safety Board is. Reynolds stated that in the State of Indiana, a Town Council serves as the Safety Board by State Statute, and they have exclusive control of the Public Safety in their town. It is not a Merit Board.


Town Attorney, Hunt Reynolds, also explained what a Special Session is. At the beginning of each year, the Town Attorney or the Clerk Treasurer will send a list of all regular meeting dates for the entire year to the news media. Any meeting scheduled outside of these dates is a Special Session.


Town Council President, Bobbie Bostock, asked if there was anything that needed to be discussed. Councilwoman, Arla Jean Frazier shared just for discussion purposes, the issue about town owned vehicles being used for personal time, and to make sure there is no confusion about that policy. Council President Bostock also stated that town vehicles cannot be used for any kind of political activity. Also mentioned for possible discussion was driving a town vehicle to go to another job. It was noted by Councilwoman Frazier that our current policy states that the Police Chief has discretion over the use of the police cars and how they are used.

Town Council President Bostock asked is there was any other discussion and Councilwoman Donna Dillard had a question for Chief Sanders. She asked him if when the officers drive their vehicles home, does that mean that they are always on call? Chief Sanders stated that by allowing the officers to take their vehicles home when they are off duty and they come upon an accident or a police incident, they are able to respond. That is a benefit for the town. Council President Bostock shared that a Paoli Police car was seen in French Lick while they were working a shift for the French Lick Department. Sanders commented that the officer lives in French Lick and that the policy states surrounding county. That officer responded that he does drive his vehicle to the French Lick PD but does not use it while working that shift.

Council President asked if there was any more questions for the Safety Board and there being none, a motion was made to adjourn by Theron Owen and seconded by Arla Jean Frazier. In a 5-0 vote, motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 5:06 pm.


